needs audiences.**

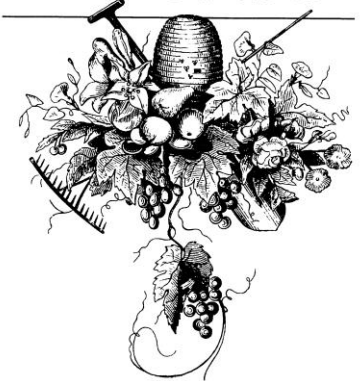
